Prepare Now for Your Urgent Care Needs

When you are worried about your health, or the health of another, the last thing you can do is initiate computer research. Get prepared now, please take a moment in healthy times to educate yourself on your options.

When considering finances, please note that a visit to your doctor, urgent care center, 247 Online Care or Independent Health's 24-hr medical help line are all available at a \$0 co-pay. Beginning in July 2019, the co-pay for a hospital's emergency room (unless you are admitted) will be \$300.

What about access to appropriate care? The NY44 Health Trust's website provides <u>some</u> <u>helpful facility guidelines</u> on when a trip to the emergency room is recommended. That page also contains a link to Independent Health's <u>directory of urgent care centers</u>. Did you know that you can also chat with an urgent care provider from the comfort of your mobile device? If you haven't done it yet, set up your <u>247 Online Care</u> account and download the app now. Still in doubt, you can also call Independent Health's <u>24-hr medical help line</u> (the number is listed on the back of your insurance card).



Send Malicious Emails to Service Desk

The service desk will provide the email to a trained technician who will look at the email, then run a script to purge it from everyone else's email inbox. The study focuses on strategies that enhance the capacity of CTE programs to improve the engagement, achievement and transition of secondary and postsecondary CTE students. All three of Erie 1 BOCES' submissions were selected for the study.




New Video Provides Overview of Middle School Initiatives
