Frontier Central School District senior Blake Anderson is creating a path for his future while studying in the Cybersecurity and Networking program at the Harkness Career and Technical Education (CTE) Center.

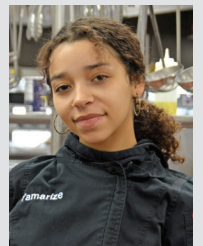
